This charming boat song has become known all over the world. It originated in Naples, but the Venetian gondoliers consider it as much their own as do the Neapolitan fishermen who sing it in time to the gentle swing of the oars. (Santa Lucia is the tutelary saint of the Neapolitans).

Fantasia "Il Trovatore" *Verdi*

Giuseppe Verdi was born near Busseto, in the Duchy of Parma, in 1814, was educated at Milan, where he produced his first opera "Oberto Conti dis Bonifacio." He died on the 27th of January, 1901. "Il Trovatore" was produced in 1853—in the second period of his activity—and placed the stamp of fame on the man who had already won widespread publicity in the realm of operatic music. The opera, with its abundant charm of Italian melody and the appealing nature of its subject, has won for itself an unflinching appreciation which in these days of wandering harmonic subtleties, extreme combination of musical form and flashing changes of instrumental colouring, is a satisfactory tribute to the fame of its talented author and of his artistic musical genius.

Owing to inclement weather the FRANCONIA did not call at Alexandria but proceeded to Port Said where passengers disembarked for Cairo.

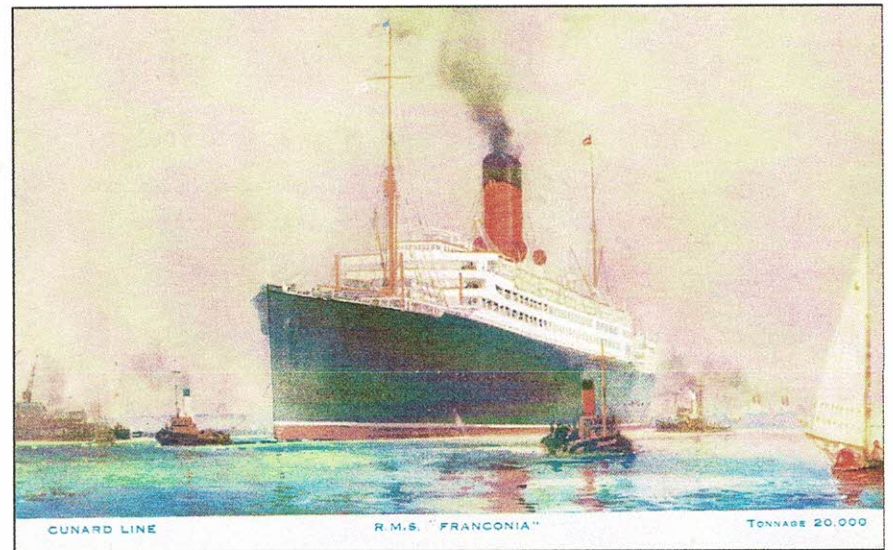
Motor cars were provided for Cairo sightseeing including the Museums, principal mosques, famous Mousky Bazaars, Pyramids and The Sphinx.

The FRANCONIA now "East of Suez" has assumed tropical attire. Gleaming white canvas covers all open spaces and passengers take their mid-day dip in the outdoor pool. All well. Clear skies and India ahead.

The passengers were issued with a notice that because of the weather it may not be possible to enter the harbour at **Alexandria** at 5pm as planned. 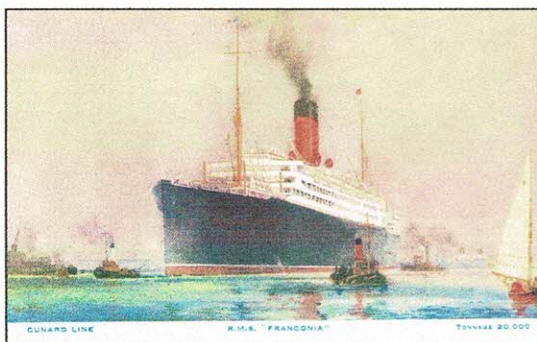

THE CHINESE SERVANT IN THE HOUSE.

One of the things there is the
most of in China is manpower. It
doesn't do much good to have
laborsaving machinery, because
labor is plentiful and cheap.
Consequently, house servants are
easy to get and not difficult to
pay. So everyone has a "crew"
working in the house.

Necessarily, there is a cook,
Also a coolie, for much of the
work is "coolie work" which the
high and mighties among the
servants consider beneath them-
selves to perform. Those who
have private rickshaw have also
a rickshaw coolie. If there are
very young children, there is an
"amah" or nurse; or perhaps
there is a "sew-sew" amah who

His pay is not great, but his
perquisites are many. He gets a
"squeeze" or commission on
nearly every purchase which
enters the house. He deals with
local tradesmen and gets his per-
centages. He sells for his own
pocket all empty bottles from the
home. He visits merchants with
whom you deal and asks for
"cumshaw" for himself. He has
been known to hold out for him-
self two dollars a month from the
coolie's pay. As boss below
stairs, he has a prestige to main-
tain, and must never lose "face".

Some families handle their
own buying. Others live on
contract with their cooks, turn-
ing over a flat sum of—sav—one
hundred dollars each month with
which the cook purchases all
foods. This is the more eco-

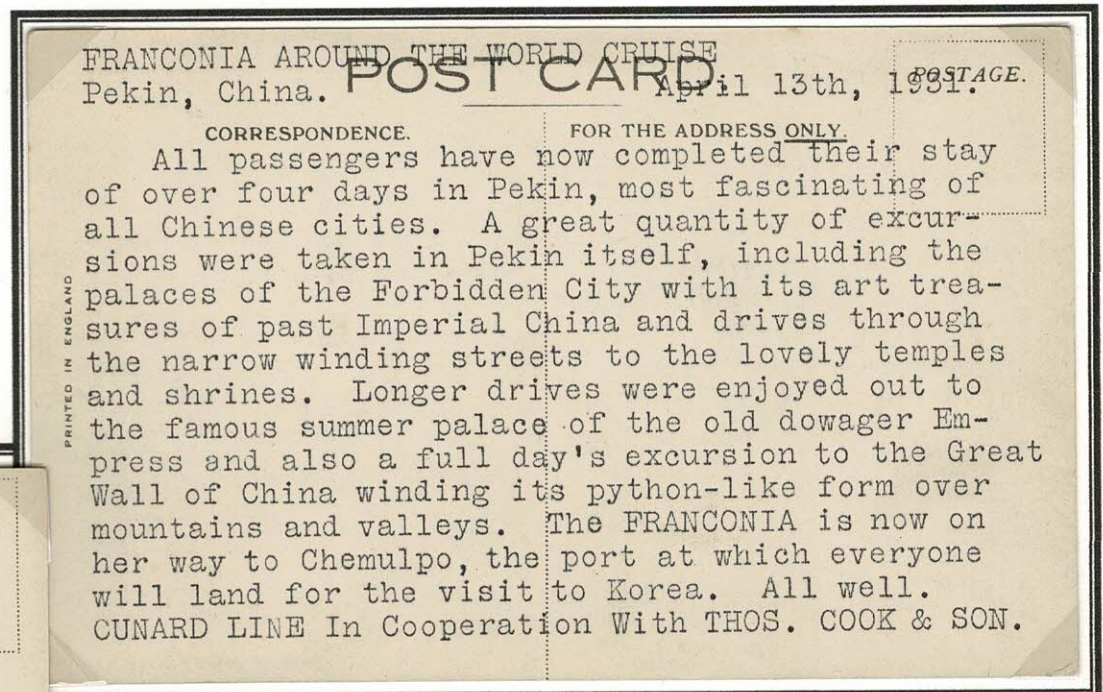

NAGASAKI

Nagasaki, situated on the N. W. coast of Kyushu Island, is one of the important seaports of Japan, being the oldest open port of the Empire. It is well situated at the head of Nagasaki Bay, a narrow land-locked inlet about 2½ m. long. Its deep harbour, one of the best and safest in Japan, is well sheltered by the encircling hills, the entrance being dotted with numerous islands forming natural breakwaters.

The city stands at the head of a beautiful natural harbour, a narrow inlet extending about 3 miles from the open sea, encircled on three sides by thickly wooded hills and open towards the west.

The city measures 5 miles from E. to W. 5 miles from N. to S. and it is divided into two sections—the down-town section and the residential quarter. The former is lively with bustling scenes of commercial activity and embraces the Hamanomachi and Kajiyamachi streets, which are flanked by typical shops of the Orient. The residential sections, rising terrace upon terrace on the hillsides, are in
